VILLAGE NEWS:

The Public Works Department would like to remind all residents that the “dump” area at the sewer plant does have an area for small branches however, whole trees are not allowed.

It is also asked that when mowing lawn residents refrain from blowing grass into the curbed street as this clogs the drop boxes.

The Village is currently working with the County on the repair of Russland Road. The Village Board at the July meeting approved resurfacing the road from Old State Road to Walnut Hill Drive. This process may take a couple of months so please continue to be patient.

POLICE NEWS:

The Village of Aviston Police Department would like to remind residents of some summer time issues:

- no boats, campers, utility trailers, RVs, etc. on the Village streets unless loading or unloading.
- swimming pools capable of holding 24 inches of water or more must have a rigid fence and must be at least 42 inches in height. All fencing should be in place before the pool is filled with water.
- curfew for anyone under 17 years of age is 11pm Sunday through Thursday and 12am on Friday and Saturday.
- vacation check forms for your home or business are available at the Village Hall or on the Village website.
- no owner of any dog shall permit such dog to disturb the peace and quiet of the neighborhood by prolonged barking or howling. Also, all dogs must be leashed in the Village limits.
